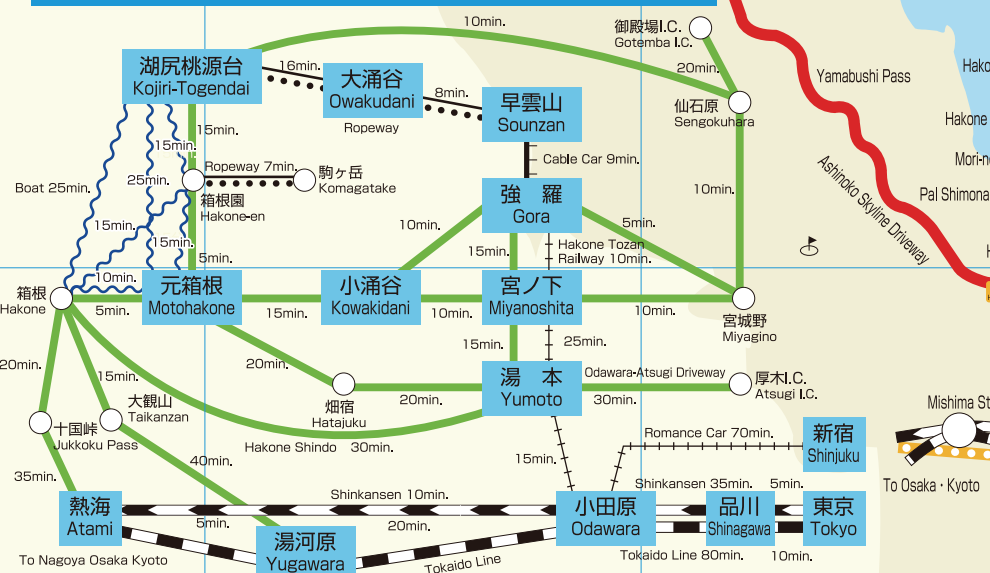

SIGHTSEEING GUIDE ON HAKONE

Parks & Museums

Hakone Geomuseum (0460-83-8140) C-2

Visitors can experience the wonders of volcanoes, the history of Hakone, and the beauty of nature. Based in Hakone Geopark, the Hakone Geomuseum offers interesting information and a variety of fun exhibits.
Open 9:00AM-4:00PM.

Hakone Botanical Garden of Wetlands (0460-84-7293) B-1

Plants in this garden are collected from major marshes all over Japan including nearby Sengokuhara Marsh.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM (Mar.20-Nov.30).

Hakone Sekisho (Checkpoint)Exhibition Hall (0460-83-6635) C-4

Hakone Sekisho, an important site for the history of transport and communication during Edo period, has been restored after 140 years. The Exhibition Hall displays many historical relics regarding the checkpoint and the old Hakone area. Open 9:00AM-5:00PM (Mar.-Nov.), 9:00AM-4:30PM (Dec.-Feb.).

Hatajuku Wooden Handicraft Center (0460-85-8170) D-3

Yosegi-zaiku is an elaborate inlaid and mosaic wooden craft made in Hakone. Boxes, toys and accessories of Yosegi-zaiku are displayed and sold at this hall.
Open 10:00AM-4:00PM. Closed from Dec.28 to Jan.3. on Mon.

Hakone Museum of History and Folklore (0460-85-7601) E-2

Exhibition of Hakone's cultural heritage. Drawings of the three main roads(Hakone Hachiri,Toji-no-Michi, and Seikatsu-no-Michi) used during the Edo era are exhibited throughout the year.
Open 9:00AM-4:30PM. Closed on Wed. and the last Mon. of every month and Dec.28-Jan.4.

Mori-no-Fureaikan Hall (0460-83-6006) C-4

Visitors can understand the forest with audio-visual aids. Also one can enjoy making key chains, photo frames and other accessories with wood chips and various kinds of nuts.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM (Mar.-Nov.). 9:00AM-4:30PM (Dec.-Feb.).

Hakone Visitor Center (0460-84-9981) B-2

This facility aims to teach visitors about the wonderful nature of the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park. Topographical models, photographs and a Hi-Vision film are available to introduce Hakone's natural surroundings.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM. Closed on the second Wed and Thu in June. and Dec.28-Jan.1. Admission free.

Hakone-en Aquarium (0460-83-1151) B-3

450 species of fish collected throughout the world from the Amazon to Lake Ashi can be seen.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

Hakone Shrine Treasure Museum (0460-83-7123) C-4

Ancient writings, picture scrolls, sculptures and other valuable artifacts are stored and exhibited. The wooden seated image of Priest Mangan, the founder of the shrine, is an important cultural property.
Open 9:00AM-4:30PM.

Hakone Museum of Art (0460-82-2623) C-2

Ancient porcelain wares of Japan and other oriental countries are on display. The Japanese garden, annexed to the museum, is beautifully landscaped.
Open 9:30AM-4:30PM (Apr.-Nov.), 9:30AM-4:00PM (Dec.-Mar.). Closed on Thu. (except Nov.) and the year-end and NewYear.

Gora Park (0460-82-2825) C-2

You can try art such as blown glass, ceramic art, sand-blast and pottery painting. Also, beautiful flowers such as bougainvilleas, tropical plants and roses welcome you through the year.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

The Hakone Open Air Museum (Chokoku-no-Mori Art Museum) (0460-82-1161) D-2

About 120 works by well-known modern and contemporary sculptors are exhibited outdoors. Also there are 5 exhibition halls including the Picasso Pavilion, as well as pieces where children can play and a footbath fed by natural hot springs.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

Hakone Venetian Glass Museum (0460-86-3111) C-1

Approximately 5,000 pieces of Venetian glassware are displayed including traditional pieces made between the 15th-19th century.
Open 10:00AM-5:30PM. (10:00AM-4:30PM on Dec. 30&31)

Narukawa Art Museum (0460-83-6828) C-4

Exhibits selected among the leading modern artists' masterpieces will surely satisfy those who love Japanese-style paintings.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

POLA Museum of Art(0460-84-2111) C-1

This museum holds about 9,500 art treasures of western modern paintings and Japanese modern paintings, which focus on Impressionism and Ecole de Paris.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

Hakone Museum of Photography (0460-82-2717) D-2

This museum is Katsura Endo's private gallery. It is a small museum in the forest. They hold a permanent exhibition of Mt.Fuji on the first floor and monthly exhibition on the second floor.
Open 10:00AM-5:00PM.

Lalique Museum, Hakone (0460-84-2255) B-1

Rene Lalique, a jewelry designer and glass maker/craftworker was a forerunner of the Art Nouveau and Art Deco era. One can enjoy his works and also have a meal in a train car of Orient Express at this museum.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

Hakone Ekiden Museum (0460-83-7511) C-4

This is a museum of the Hakone Ekiden, a university relay marathon race from Tokyo to Hakone.
Open 10:00AM-4:30PM. (Open 9:30AM-5:00PM in holidays)

Honma Yosegi Museum (0460-85-5646) F-2

A lot of Hakone yosegi-zaiku products are on display here. Visitors can create their own Hakone zaiku coasters here.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM.

Meissen Antique Museum (0460-83-8855) C-2

This museum exhibits more than 300 Meissen's porcelain pieces and antique cups and saucers.
Open 9:00AM-5:30PM.

Tamamura Toyoo Life Art Museum (0460-83-1071) C-4

Mr.Toyoo Tamamura is an essayist, artist, farmer and winery-owner and this museum displays and sells his water-color paintings.
Open 10:30AM-5:00PM.

Pal Shimonaka Memorial Hall (03-5261-5688) C-4

This memorial hall extols the great achievement of Radhabinod Pal, who is known for the dissentient judgement at the International Military Tribunal for the Far East and Yasaburo Shimonaka, the founder of Heibonsha. (Prior booking is required.)

Okada Museum of Art (0460-87-3931) C-2

Exhibits Japanese, Chinese and Korean works of art ranging from ancient times through to the present age, collected by the businessman Okada Kazuo.
Open 9:00AM-5:00PM. Closed on Dec. 31, Jan. 1.

Historic & Scenic Spots

Hakone Shrine C-4

Called "Hakone Gongen (or avatar)," and founded in 757 by Priest Mangan, a noted priest in the Nara period (710-784). The shrine has been worshipped as a guardian deity by pious warriors who ruled the region.

Cedar Avenue C-4

Cedar trees were planted along the old Tokaido Highway in 1618 when the Hakone post town was opened. The trees shaded travelers in summer and protected the road from snow in winter. About 400 trees are remaining today.

Hakone Checkpoint C-4

The checkpoint was established in 1619 by the Tokugawa Shogunate Government as a safeguard against the rebellion of subordinate feudal lords. Abolished in 1819 and restored in 1965.

Sounji Temple E-3

This temple was built in 1521 as the family temple of the Hojo Clan by Ujitsuna Hojo, the lord of this area. Named after his father, Soun Hojo. In the precinct, there are many valuable properties such as the portrait of Soun Hojo designated as an important cultural property.

Stone Buddhas C-3

At the foot of Mt.Kami-Futago, there are many stone Buddhist images of Jizo, a guardian deity of children and other saints. They are natural stone carving made in the 13th century, during the Kamakura period. Many of them are important cultural properties.

Stone-Paved Road C-4

The original stone-paved road was built in the 17th century to ease the travel through the steep mountains in bad weather when the trail became muddy. Remains of this road are preserved as historic relics.

Owakudani Valley C-2

Sulfurous fumes and clouds of steam rise constantly from the old crater of Mt.Kami. Bubbling hot waters are piped to distant spas. The place is known for its magnificent view of Mt.Fuji.

Lake Ashinoko

A crater lake formed by volcanic activity four thousand years ago. It has a 20km circumference with a depth of 43m at the deepest point. The lake abounds in pond smelt, trout, carp and other fish.

Sengokuhara Marsh B-1

To the north of Lake Ashi, Sengokuhara Marsh has many rare marshy plants protected as a natural monument by the government.

Kintoki Shrine B-1

At the foot of Mt.Kintoki, the shrine is dedicated to Kintoki Sakata, a legendary hero called "Kintaro" in his childhood. Today his name indicates a high-spirited healthy boy and children enjoy hearing his story.
